Cheryl A. Boyce Health Science Education Scholarship

ACADEMIC YEAR 2022-2023

The Ohio Federation for Health Equity and Social Justice is a nonprofit organization incorporated in Ohio. It is principally made up of agencies, organizations, and individuals concerned about minority and multicultural health, health equity, social justice, and the elimination of health disparities in racial/ethnic populations. Cheryl A. Boyce was co-founder of the Ohio Federation for Health Equity and Social Justice. Before this, she served as the Executive Director of the Ohio Commission on Minority Health from its inception in 1986 through late 2010. She earned a B.S. in Health Education from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale and an M.S. in Health Planning and Administration from the University of Cincinnati.

In her honor, the Cheryl A. Boyce Health Science Education Scholarship was created for eligible underrepresented high school students of Asian, Black, Latino or Native American race or ethnicity who seek to achieve an undergraduate degree in health sciences.

Health Sciences can include health education, nursing, biology, chemistry, allied health, public health, sports medicine, dentistry, occupational therapy, physical therapy, respiratory therapy, public health, hospital administration, and medical dietetics.

The Scholarship Committee award is up to four (4) individual awards at \$1,000.00 per academic year for a high school senior.

- Students must reside and attend a high school in the State of Ohio
- · Eligible under-represented high school students of Asian, Native American, Black, and Latino race/ethnicity
- Must be a graduating high school senior for the 2022 2023 school year
- 2.0 Minimum GPA overall or progression towards un-weighed GPA of 2.0 over the course of four semesters
- Official high school transcript
- Provide evidence of a minimum ten (10) hours community service
- Acceptance letter from college/university starting Fall 2023 or Winter 2024
- · Essay from one of the four topics listed in application
- · Two typewritten Letters of recommendation, one from a school official such as an administrator, guidance counselor or teacher and one from a person in the community
- Complete a face-to-face panel interview of the applicant with the review committee

From moments after his diagnosis to learning how to walk again, cameras documented Paris' journey through the trials and tribulations - detailing the excruciating process through it all.



Multiple Myeloma (MM) Awareness

Multiple Myeloma (MM) is a blood plasma cancer usually found in older adults. MM is more common in men than women. On average, Black Americans are diagnosed at the age of 66, but it's possible to be diagnosed at an even younger age. In people under the age of 50, MM is 3x more common in Black Americans compared to White Americans. Insufficient community awareness about MM, as well as reduced access to healthcare, likely play a role in the higher number of diagnoses in Black people. These communities are also underrepresented in clinical trials.

At first, the plasma cells reproduce in the bone marrow of the spine. From there, they enter the bloodstream and travel to bone marrow in other parts of the body. They collect in the bone marrow and the hard, outer part of the bones. As this progression happens, the plasma cells can cause multiple tumors.

MM causes many symptoms, but bone pain often is the first symptom people notice. It often occurs in the back, the hips, and sometimes the skull. Some patients may experience pain that is worse at night, which disrupts their sleep. Other symptoms include: Weakness in your arms and legs and/or a sensation of numbness in your arms and legs. MM can affect the bones in your spine, causing them to collapse and press on your spinal cord. When you have MM, your bones may easily break.

Exposure to toxic chemicals, atomic radiation, anything that interferes with the immune system, or infection with cancer-causing viruses, may potentially be linked to the developing MM. This disease is more likely in people who come into contact with chlorinated solvents such as 1,1,1-Trichloroethane (TCA), Trichloroethylene (TCE), Methylene chloride (DCM), Perchloroethylene (PCE).

Women who use or have used prednisone, insulin, or gout medication have an increased risk of MM. While veterans do not know all of the disabilities that may arise due to exposure to contaminated water, one of the most prevalent illnesses is MM.

Infection is a major complication in patients with MM. The risk of infection is due to a multifactorial immunodeficiency caused by the disease itself and the treatment regimens given during the different phases of therapy.

Stress can be a very destructive force when it comes to MM. Stress really disrupts the immune system and MM is a cancer of the immune system. In addition, the stress hormone noradrenaline (the "flight" hormone, versus adrenaline, the "fight" hormone) can actually trigger cancer cell growth directly.

Often, MM causes no symptoms until it reaches an advanced stage. MM might cause vague symptoms that at first seem to be caused by other diseases. Sometimes, MM is found early when a routine blood test shows an abnormally high amount of protein in the blood. A bone marrow biopsy is required to confirm the diagnosis of MM. A needle is inserted into the bone marrow space to remove a small sliver of bone marrow. Hematopathologists examine the tissue under a microscope to determine if there are myeloma cells in the bone marrow.

A biography of Queen Elizabeth II revealed that the monarch was suffering from bone marrow cancer before her death at her summer residence, Balmoral Castle, Aberdeen Shire, Scotland on September 8, 2022, at the age of 96 after a reign of 70 years.




